
TOPIC: THE EVANGELIST'S MESSAGE

TEXT: Acts 2 v 14 - 41

Read Snapshot "The Bridge

THE BRIDGE

The bridge illustration works well because it can be drawn simply and clearly. In this illustration, there's a hill on one side, a chasm in the middle, and another hill on the other side. Sin separates a person from God. The result of trying to get to God on our own will be death—both physical and spiritual. There's only one way to cross the chasm of sin and that's the bridge. The cross of Jesus spans the distance between us and God the Father. Jesus Christ is the only way to God. When we trust in His death on the cross, we are freed from the power of sin and the judgment of death.

Read Snapshot "The Roman Road"

THE ROMAN ROAD

There is a classic three-step presentation of how to become a Christian often called The Roman Road, because it is all right in the Book of Romans.

This approach seems to be most effective when people are nearing a point of decision. At this point, they simply need a brief biblical explanation of the essence of Christianity. First, Romans 3:23 says, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." We must

acknowledge our own sin. Second, Romans 6:23 says, "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." The wages, or payment. for our sins is death. However, the wonderful gift offered by God is forgiveness and eternal life in Jesus. Third, Romans 10:13 says, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." When we call on Jesus for forgiveness, He will cleanse us, give us a new beginning, and help us live as His children forever.
